Now part of a world-wide network of Monarch Waystations, Art Barn's monarch habitat supports the threatened butterflies during their whole life-cycle. Milkweed along with other feeder flowers provide monarchs with breeding resources, resting and refuelling stops during migration, as well as nourishment to survive overwintering. asclepius verticillata (whorled milkweed)



* FUN FACT: Eating toxic milkweed makes Monarch caterpillars and butterflies poisonous to predators!



asclepius tuberosa (butterfly weed)



monarda didyma (bee balm)



agastach (hyssop)



phlox paniculata (phlox)



sedum spectacle (autumn joy)



buddleia weyeriana (butterfly bush)

* FUN FACT: Monarch caterpillars feed exclusively on the leaves of milkweed - they need it to complete their life cycle.
